## Candidate's statement

International Society of Electrochemistry was founded in 1949 by leading European and American Electrochemists to serve the growing needs of electrochemistry in becoming a modern scientific discipline. Since then the association has evolved and now comprises about 3000 individual members and more than 20 Corporate Members and Corporate Sustaining Members (industrial and commercial organizations). Its membership comes from more than 70 countries and is organized in over 40 regional sections from all five continents. ISE is, therefore, a world-wide non-profit-making organization, whose activities rely on an efficient and transparent management of its financial resources.

As current treasurer of the Society I have learned a great deal about the management of ISE's finances and I would like to make this experience available to the Society and its members in a second term.
